



- Planning for entire landscapes (cross jurisdiction)
 - Working across scales
- *Proactive* planning that anticipates future change
- Partnerships lead by states, Tribes/First Nations, federal agencies, NGOs

Opportunities and Barriers for Engagement and Leveraging Across Boundaries

- Working together we can do more than we can individually

- Limited budgets, limited time for landscape-scale work (meeting fatigue)
